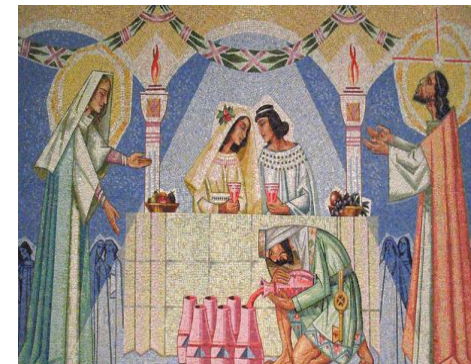

What is Natural Family Planning?

Today we understand the human body, especially the reproductive system, much better than we did even 20 years ago. Fertility specialists have taught us how to determine when a woman is likely to conceive, and when she is infertile. Using this knowledge, we can now show couples how to achieve or avoid pregnancy with up to 99% effectiveness; that's higher than any method of simple contraception, according to the World Health Organization.

Natural Family Planning is highly personalized. Every woman learns how to understand her own body and its cycles, through one or more simple biological signs. With her husband, the two of them discuss and record their observations, gaining an awareness of and new appreciation for their shared fertility. If a couple wants to conceive, they make love on fertile days. If they need to wait – well, they wait until the infertile times. The average woman is fertile 8-10 days a month. NFP works for women of any age even with an irregular cycle.

What if I have an irregular cycle or fertility problems?

If you have fertility problems, we can help you raise the odds that you'll conceive. The Creighton Model is now available in the Diocese of Lansing. This model can be utilized by ALL women, married or single, who are interested in taking control of and understanding their own reproductive and gynecological health. It is safe, effective, and works cooperatively with a woman's cycle to identify and treat a wide variety of issues including, infertility and/or repetitive miscarriages; PMS; PCOD; menstrual cramps, abnormal bleeding; postpartum depression; and premenopause symptoms. What are the benefits of NFP?

Natural Family Planning is advantageous for many reasons! The most wonderful benefit is mutual cooperation of the couple, which enhances communication skills and respect for one another's fertility. NFP is also:

- *Harmless* to the human body – NFP users utilize the natural signs of fertility and use no drugs, chemicals or barriers to impair normal bodily function.
- *Reliable* - when used as taught, couples using NFP can expect a 99% rate of effectiveness to postpone pregnancy.
- *Inexpensive* – after initial instruction, NFP can cost as low as \$4/year for all materials!
- Marital strength – NFP marriages have a less than 5% divorce rate in part due to continual communication.

Are engaged couples Required to take NFP?

All engaged couples getting married in the Diocese of Lansing must complete an Introductory course in NFP or a formal class in NFP. Many couples may decide to take the three part series of Natural Family Planning upon completion of the Introduction video-assisted program. Your parish priest may require you to take a course in NFP (often called “the 3-part series”) as part of your Marriage Preparation instead of the Introduction Program.

What is the Introduction to NFP?

The *Introduction to NFP* is one portion of the Marriage Preparation process for the Diocese of Lansing. The *Introduction to Natural Family Planning* is a 2 hour class designed specifically for engaged and married couples. It includes a video called *Introduction to Natural Family Planning*, as

well as time for discussion and a basic lesson in NFP. This program helps couples learn the benefits of using NFP in their marriage. It explains the Church's teaching on the beauty of married love and human sexuality. The *Introduction* is often taught as one of the Basic Catholic Teaching or Catholic Information Series class as part of Marriage Preparation in some regions.

Are Couples required to take additional instruction in Natural Family Planning?

As part of your Marriage Preparation, you may be required to take a formal 3-part series class in Natural Family Planning, instead of the Introduction Classes. The Natural Family Planning Program of the Diocese of Lansing offers classes in the Billings Ovulation Method and Creighton Model, beside the Sympto-Thermal Method by Couple to Couple League. Home study courses on Sympto-Thermo are also available on-line. You may contact the NFP office for a class schedule of these classes or the websites.

Where can I take the Introduction Class?

The *Introduction* is offered in various regions of the Diocese of Lansing. Schedules are available by calling the NFP Office at (517) 342-2587, or by e-mailing: nfp@dioceseoflansing.org, or by checking the Diocese of Lansing website. Couples will receive a letter from the Department of Catholic Charities and a Certificate of Completion, to be included in their Marriage Preparation file at their parish upon successful attendance of the Introduction Class.

Cost for taking the Class?

There is a charge for the *Introduction to Natural Family Planning Class*, when offered by parishes as scheduled in this brochure. The cost for the *Introduction to Natural Family Planning Class* is **\$10.00** per couple, which is payable prior to the first day of class.
