Words from Fr. Andrew


Sandwiched right in the middle of February, this week has plenty to offer.

For starters, this Sunday is Feb 14th --- St. Valentine's Day. According to legend, the Valentine takes its name from a young Christian priest who lived in ancient Rome. Like so many of the early Christians, Valentine had been imprisoned because of his faith..Often he thought of his loved ones and wanted to assure them of his well being and of his love for them...Beyond his cell window, just within reach, grew a cluster of violets. He picked some of the heart shaped leaves and pricked them with the words, "Remember your Valentine", and sent them off by a friendly dove... On the next day, and the next, he sent more messages that simply said, "I love you." Thus did the Valentine have its beginning. And so it has been through the ages....Those who love, remember... and send Valentines to express their love. Happy Valentine's Day to all! Will you be my Valentine?

Tuesday, February 16 Is Mardi Gras. Start your morning with an array of freshly baked *paczki* (*eight flavors*) and *cannoli* (imported from Mannino's Bakery in Sterling Heights.) Our bakery booth will be open at 6:00 am. Don't go too far away – come and eat your fill of spaghetti at our annual Mardi Gras dinner. Back by popular demand, our gathering will be enhanced by the sounds of legendary Willie George , Kevin Fish and Friends. Guaranteed to be the best jazz in the North. There will be plenty of Mardi Gras beads.

After Mardi Gras, enter **ASH WEDNESDAY**. Remember it's one of the two days that those of us who are over the age of 18 are called upon to fast and to abstain from meat. It's also the day we join in solidarity with the poor and hungry by donating to the United Lenten Appeal of Genesee County, helping the local charities that directly help our neighbors in need. In addition to the four regularly scheduled Masses, we will have a very short prayer service at 6:00 am for those whose schedules prevent them from joining us at Mass. The Stations of the Cross will be prayed on Wednesday mornings and Friday evenings. What a great way to walk the walk with Jesus, the reason for the season. With spring less than forty days away, it's not too soon to start thinking of Andy's Attic. May I recommend that you start a corner or pile somewhere for those treasures that you no longer need. I already have several boxes filled with such treasures. Depending on availability of the barn, we're looking at a week in late May or June. In any event, it'll be here before you know it!

If good weather conditions prevail, hopefully this is the week we're going to see a lot of each other! Count me in!!

What is Scrip? Scrip is a term that means "substitute money". When you purchase Scrip you are purchasing negotiable gift certificates and prepaid cards. These cards can be used for **everyday purchases**, not just for gifts. When you use Scrip to buy your **everyday purchases** you are earning extra revenue for St. John.

How do I earn extra revenue for St. John by using Scrip? We buy our Scrip from Great Lakes Scrip Center, at a discount. We then resell the card at face value. A \$25.00 prepaid card with a 5% earns the parish \$1.25. What an **easy way** to contribute to help **reduce the debt** on the Family Center, without spending any extra dollars.

We have prepaid cards for gas, groceries, discount stores, department stores, fast food restaurants and fine dining. Stop by the parish office or the Family Center on Tuesday nights or go online to www.shopwithscrip.com to see what is available. Guidelines for Lenten Observance

Lent begins on Wednesday, February 17, 2010. Below are the guidelines for our Lenten observance.

- **Ash Wednesday, February 17th, and Good Friday, April 2nd** are days of **fast and abstinence** (Canon 1251)
- **Fridays of Lent** are days of **abstinence** (Canon 1251)

Fasting binds all persons who have completed their 18th birthday through those who have completed their 59th year, unless prevented by poor health. On days of fast, one full meal is allowed. Two other meals sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to one's own needs. Eating between meals is not allowed, although fluids may be taken.

Abstinence binds all persons who have completed their 14th birthday, unless prevented by poor health. On days of abstinence during Lent, the consumption of meat of mammals or fowl is not allowed. The Church strongly encourages the observance of Friday abstinence throughout the year, but failure to do so is not regarded as sinful.

Nevertheless, pastors of souls and parents are to take care that minors not bound by the law of fast & abstinence are also educated in a genuine sense of penance. (Canon 1252)

Lent is a penitential season and as such religious practice such as daily Mass, reception of the Sacrament of Penance, the devotion of the Stations of the Cross, works of charity and justice, and acts of self-denial are highly encouraged.
