Words from Fr. Andrew

A priest working in the inner city was walking down an alley one evening on his way home when a young man came down the alley behind him and poked a knife against his back, "Give me your money," the young man said.

Father opened his jacket and reached into an inner pocket to remove his wallet exposing his clerical collar, "Oh, I'm sorry, Father," said the young man, "I didn't see your collar, I don't want YOUR money"

Trembling from the scare, the priest removed a cigar from his shirt pocket and offered it to the young man, "Here," he said, "Have a cigar."

"Oh, no! I can't do that," replied the young man, "I gave them up for Lent!"

Lent is here! Lent is a time for *Saying Yes to Less*. What shall we say less to? May I suggest some or all of the following:

- GIVE UP grumbling! Instead, "In everything give thanks." Constructive criticism is OK, but "moaning, groaning and complaining" are not Christian disciplines.
- GIVE UP 10 to 15 minutes in bed! Instead use that time in prayer, Bible study or journaling.
- GIVE UP looking at other people's worst points. Instead concentrate on their best points, We all have faults, It is a lot easier to have people overlook our shortcomings when we overlook their first.
- GIVE UP your hatred of anyone or anything! Instead, remember Jesus' words on the cross, "Father, forgive them; they do not know what they do."
- GIVE UP your worries and anxieties! Instead, trust God with them. Live today and let God's grace be sufficient.
- GIVE UP buying anything but essentials for yourself! Instead, give the money to God. The money you would spend on the luxuries could help someone meet basic needs. We are all called to be stewards of God's riches, not consumers. (consider donating to the Genesee County United Lenten Appeal – our charities at home are desperate.

This week-end those who are catechumens and candidates among us will be participating in the Rite of Election with Bishop Boyea at St. John the Baptist Church in Howell-Hartland. As they meet with Bishop and become elected to receive the sacraments, we are encouraged to remember them in prayer especially during the Lenten season. Let us also keep their Godparents, sponsors and team members in prayer that all may be instruments of the Holy Spirit.

Please circle your calendar and pass the date for our Fabulous Fish Fry on Friday, March 12 – that's only 19 days away! And nine days after that will be SPRING! Can we count you in?

Here's to a meaningful Lent. Remember Lent is the time to say "Yes to Less."

SCRIP

What is Scrip? Scrip is a term that means "substitute money". When you purchase Scrip you are purchasing negotiable gift certificates and prepaid cards. These cards can be used for **everyday purchases**, not just for gifts. When you use Scrip to buy your **everyday purchases** you are earning extra revenue for St. John.

How do I earn extra revenue for St. John by using Scrip? We buy our Scrip from Great Lakes Scrip Center, at a discount. We then resell the card at face value. A \$25.00 prepaid card with a 5% earns the parish \$1.25. What an **easy way** to contribute to help **reduce the debt** on the Family Center, without spending any extra dollars.

We have prepaid cards for gas, groceries, discount stores, department stores, fast food restaurants and fine dining. Stop by the parish office or the Family Center on Tuesday nights or go online to www.shopwithscrip.com to see what is available.
