Words from Fr. Andrew

Last week, we recalled the temptations of Jesus in the desert. Today, we retell the story of his Transfiguration (Luke 9:28-36). As that event unfolds,

I am reminded of visits to Mt. Tabor where Jesus' Transfiguration took place. Talk about a *peak experience!*

The mount of the Transfiguration rises majestically above the plain. The steep road is accessible only by taxis which provide one of the most thrilling rides to the top. If you're fortunate to get the seat closest to the road, you find yourself humming "*Nearer My God to Thee!*" For over 1000 years, pilgrims have made the trek to the top to see where the event took place. At present, there is a beautiful church featuring three chapels—one for Jesus, one for Moses, and one for Elijah. In addition to a great view, the silence speaks volumes! (There is a guest house where pilgrims can lodge over night or stay longer and make a silent retreat. The gift shop is manned by former prisoners from Sicily who are reentering society.)

The Transfiguration is like a *sneak preview*. It's a sneak preview of what is yet to come. Someday, but not yet!

In the meantime, as we walk the walk day by day, we are called to continue the Lenten journey. I encourage you to be in solidarity with Jesus and His church. To unite our thoughts, words and deeds with Him so that everything becomes part of His Way. I also invite you to think often of those who are eagerly awaiting Baptism at Easter. Starting next week, those elected for Baptism will be with us for the Scrutinies, asking God to enlighten them to see themselves as God sees them. As Jesus reminds us, do not underestimate the power of prayer.

Speaking of prayer, next Saturday morning, our parish hosts a regional First Saturday Morning of Prayer for World Peace. Sponsored by the World Apostolate of Fatima, the morning includes Mass with Father George, Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, Confessions (3 priests), Rosary and prayers for peace. A light reception will follow.

I've lost count as to the number of Fish Fries around town these days. But, quantity does not equal our One and Only Fabulous Fish Fry on Friday, March 12! In addition to having the reputation of having the best around, the ambience is unequalled. Tons of helping hands (and feet) are needed to make it happen. 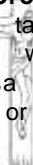
