Words from Fr. Andrew .....

There can be no better way to mark the middle of August and the third Sunday of the month than by celebrating the Solemnity of Mary's

Assumption into Heaven. This event commemorates the teaching of our church that at the end of her earthly life, Mary, the Mother of the Lord, was taken up into heaven, body and soul. This teaching was proclaimed sixty years ago by Pope Pius XII on 1 November 1950. It was nothing new --from earliest times, the People of God believed that Mary, as the new Eve, was the first to receive the benefits of Jesus' Resurrection – victory over death.

A trip down memory lane recalls growing up at All Saints Parish in Flint and bringing bouquets of fresh flowers (zinnias, daisies, straw flowers) to church and placing them on the Communion rail and altar steps. (In those days, the communion rail offset the sanctuary from the pews and was the place where people knelt down to receive only the Host on their tongues at Communion time.) Sometimes it seemed that there were hundreds of bouquets to be blessed. Father would bless them and after Mass we would take them home and place the soon-to-be-dried flowers in our household to remind us that someday we too shall be found pleasing to the Lord. Whether we have a floral bouquet to present today or not in order to honor Mary, how about a spiritual bouquet? Sometime today, I suggest you look up at the blue sky and pray a Hail Mary. ***Mary, our Mother, assumed into heaven, pray for us that when our earthly pilgrimage is over we too may enter God's heavenly presence.***

Speaking of pilgrimage, the land that Jesus lived and loved is calling again: ***COME AND SEE!*** Pope John Paul II speaks of the Holy Land as being the Fifth Gospel - we walk in the very places that our Savior walked. Even the olive trees in the Garden of Gethsemane are still at the very spot where he prayed the night he was betrayed. The pilgrimage is March 23 - March 31, 2011. That time of the year is ideal - it is spring and, if we're lucky, we'll see the desert bloom. Since Easter is not until April 24, we'll actually be at the very places that are highlighted during Lent, Holy Week and Easter. Will it be safe? Our safety is always foremost – this will be my ninth journey to the Holy Land and every single pilgrim has returned - not the same because God still is working miracles in the hearts of those who take him up on his invitation - ***COME AND SEE!***

Happy Assumption. Happy August.

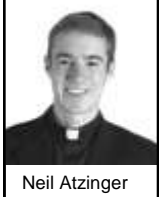

**Man Law** - Next Wednesday is St. Louis's feast day. Louis lived in the days of high chivalry, and in this virtue of chivalry St. Louis was among the highest. 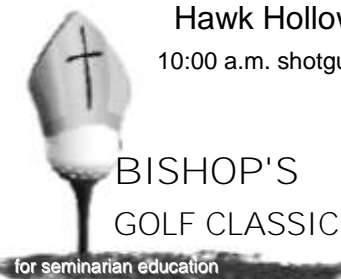
